



School health policy and information on Coronavirus (COVID-19) Disease

1. All students, parents, teachers and staff has been temperature checked upon entry to the school. We are closely monitoring the temperature and health of everyone within the school community.
2. All students, parents, teachers and staff who had traveled to any of the infected countries are prohibited to go back to school and will follow the 14-day mandatory isolation (self-quarantine) period.
3. The school regularly does a deep clean of the entire school and will continue to do so during this time.
4. The school continuously educates and trains everyone about the best ways to protect against the virus.
5. The school has promoted more frequent hand washing with soap in children, teachers and staff and have encouraged the school community to wear a surgical mask when in public or crowded areas.
6. Arrival in Thailand and exposure survey for Covid-19 was sent out last February 27 for documentation and mandatory self-quarantine.
7. The school is strictly implementing passport checking of all new students to confirm the student's travel destinations since 1 February 2020.
8. The school is currently getting ready for an online-based learning through an e-learning platform when needed and required. The teachers might need to teach children remotely.
